- •OT Deut 32:17, Ps 106:37; Lev 17:7 (sa'ir)
 •NT -
 - A. evil or "unclean" spirits aligned w satan
 - B. fallen angels; Jude 1:6, 2 Peter 2:4
 - C. "spirits" worshiped thru idols. 1 Cor 10:20-21

JESÜS

What is the "Abyss"

A. The abyss is here the place of containment and ultimate judgment of the rebellious spirits (cf. Rev 9:1–2, 11; 11:7; 2 Pet 2:4; Jude 6). Nolland, J. (1989). (Vol. 35A, p. 414). Dallas: Word, Incorporated.

B. Jail (Abyss) vs roaming in search of a "host." Luke 11:25

JESUS 1. Jesus saw demons as real.

- 1. He dialogued with a demon. Lk 8:30
- 2. He rebuked demons. Luke 4:35, Mt 17:18
- 3. He "delivered" people from them. Luke 11:20, Mk 1:25, 9:25, 16:9, etc.

JESUS

2. Jesus came to do something about them.

- 1 Jn. 3:8 Whoever makes a practice of sinning is of the devil, for the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil.
- •Luke 8:35, 4:18

2. Jesus came to do something about them.

• Heb. 2:14 Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil,

JESUS 3. How can we learn from the man's condition?

•1 Cor. 10:20-21 No, I imply that what pagans sacrifice, they offer to demons and not to God. I do not want you to be participants with demons.²¹ You cannot drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons. You cannot partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons.

JESUS

4. All Jesus needed was "Jesus."

•Lk. 8:27 When Jesus had stepped out on land, there met him a man from the city who had demons. ... I beg you, do not torment me."²⁹ For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man.

JESUS 5. Jesus' presence "flushed" the darkness.

 Lk. 8:27-28 When Jesus had stepped out on land, there met him a man from the city who had demons. ...²⁸ When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me."

JESUS 6. Jesus saw the oppressed with compassion and grace.

- 1. Dehumanized. Self destructive.
- 2. Kept company with the dead, not the living.
- 3. Superhuman strength.
- 4. Knowledge that others did not Son of God.
- 5. He is afraid of Jesus.
