



- 1. One word ("logos" in Greek) describes who Jesus is and was.
  - 1. John 1:14
  - 2. John 1:1, 1:18
  - 3. Phil 2:6-7

Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; <sup>7</sup> but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. (Phil. 2:6-**7 NIV)** 



2. One word ("logos") describes Jesus' creative nature and his desire that we enjoy his handiwork.



3. One word ("logos") envisions the content of God's vision for us – God with us!

- Jn. 1:4 In him was <u>life</u>, and the life was the <u>light of men</u>. (ESV)
- Jn. 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. <u>I came</u> that they may have life and have it abundantly. (ESV)
- Acts 2:38, Isaiah 7:14



- 4. God seals the "logos" until we receive the gift of Logos by faith.
  - John 1:11-13

- Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, <u>but the Spirit</u> who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God, (1 Cor. 2:12 NAU)
