
# 



# 1. God is not a disinterested bystander – even when we are.

- A. Jonah (prophet) finally prayed. 2:2, 7
- B. God responded. 2:10.
- C. God is in control of <u>deliverance</u> (not Jonah). 2:10

## 2. Jonah held on to what nearly destroyed him.

- Jon. 2:5-6:
- a. Waters closed in
- b. Deep surrounded me
- c. Weeds wrapped about my head
- d. Down to the land whose bars closed upon me forever

## 3. Jonah clung to his hatred; and, God just waited.

- Jon. 2:8 "Those who cling to worthless idols <u>turn away from God's love for</u> <u>them</u>. NIV
- Jon. 2:7 When my life was fainting away, I remembered the LORD, and my prayer came to you, ... 10 and the Lord spoke to the fish.

### 4. Times of crisis draw us to the only one who can do something – God.

Jon. 2:7 When my life was <u>fainting away</u>, I <u>remembered</u> the LORD, and <u>my prayer</u> <u>came to you</u>, ... 10 and the Lord spoke to the fish.

#### 5. Deliverance belongs to the Lord.

Jon. 2:9 But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Deliverance belongs to the LORD!" (NRS)



#### Next Steps.

- 1. Make prayer your "right hand."
- 2. Ask God to send you his "deliverer," His "fish."
- 3. Let go of any "idols"; put them away and turn to God.
- 4. Spend your extra time with those who matter in your life.

#### Next Steps.
