Finding God in Times of Loss

1. Boaz saw Ruth with eyes that were different than everyone around him.

Ruth 2:13 Then she said, "I have found favor in your eyes, my lord, for you have comforted me and spoken kindly to your servant, though I am not like one of your servants." (ESV).

2. Silence is easily misinterpreted as an absence of support.

 And Ruth the Moabite said to Naomi, "Let me go to the field and glean among the ears of grain after him in whose sight I shall find favor." And she said to her, "Go, my daughter." (Ruth 2:2 ESV)

3. The Lord does not forget acts of kindness we extend to others.

The LORD repay you for what you have done, and a full reward be given you by the LORD, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge!" (Ruth 2:12 ESV)

4. Ruth brought hope home.

And she took it up and went into the city. Her mother-in-law saw what she had gleaned. She also brought out and gave her what food she had left over after being satisfied. (Ruth 2:18 ESV)

- 1. Ask God to give you an opportunity to bring hope to someone in need.
- 2. Pray about your current mindset in our racial crisis: are you "in step" with Christ or "in step" with the flesh?
