- Female leader in a male dominated society
- Judge in Israel from 1195 BC 1155 BC
- Civil and Military Authority
- Prophetess

How does Deborah describe herself?

- Not as prophetess
- Not as a general
- Not as a judge or political power player

Deborah describes herself as a mother in Israel.

What does this say about how she sees her leadership role?

Deborah was able to lead as a mother to Israel by practicing a ministry of presence.

Under a palm tree as Judge

Listened to the people and their disputes

Present with the people in their difficulties

Helped the people resolve problems fairly and peacefully

Modern Day Palm Trees

- Places where we talk about the things that really matter
- Moments when we listen and connect
- Methods that work for each person in each season.
- What does this look like in different seasons of life?
- What ways can you make yourself available to each person in your family?
- Do you need to create different types of Palm Tree moments for different members of your family?

Deborah practiced a ministry of presence as a prophetess.

- Deborah listens to God. She practices abiding in the presence of God.
- Deborah speaks what God has said to her.
- What things is God speaking to you?
- Do you trust his voice?
- Do you trust your ability to hear him?

Deborah practice a ministry of presence in battle

- Deborah was present with Barak and the soldiers in battle.
- She didn't just tell them what to do, she came along side them.
- Living out a ministry of presence with our families means that we stand with them in difficult times.
- We do not do their fighting for them, but we walk with them into the fight.

- Deborah did not usurp Barak's role
- Deborah did not tak over and do the fighting for Barak while he followed.
- Moms, we have to remember the specific things God calls us to do, and do not more or no less.

The Importance of Deborah's Presence

- Barak knew the presence of the prophetess was a tangible representation of God's presence with them.
- Her presence demonstrated her belief that God would give them victory.
- What does your presence say to your family?
- How can you be "present" when you can not physically be there?
