

1. Biblical faith is the confident belief that my hopes will be realized, in spite of...

- A. Heb. 11:1 Now faith is the <u>assurance</u> of things hoped for, the <u>conviction</u> [evidence] of things not seen. (ESV)
 - "assurance" confidence, certainty;
 - "conviction" evidence, proof.

B. My heart's <u>desires</u> are the <u>seed</u> of what I hope for.

2. My faith is of utmost importance to God.

- Heb. 11:6 And without faith it is <u>impossible</u> to please Him, for he who comes to God must <u>believe that He is</u> and that He is a <u>rewarder</u> of those who seek Him.
 - "Impossible" powerless, unable; wo a chance
 - "Rewarder" literally, one who pays wages; one who renders in return for performance.

3. Our faith-filled prayers put God to "work."

 My faith + my prayers moves God. God moves mountains. (EM Bounds) 4. Believers are called to believe in spite of delays. Timing is in God's hands, not ours.

And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised, 40 since God had provided something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect. (Heb. 11:39-40 ESV)
