The Story of the Restoration of Jerusalem is not the story of individual restoration.

This is the story of how God restored a people – a community – a nation.



The Challenge:

- Think beyond your individual, personal relationship with God.
- Think about how God leverages your personal relationship with him to impact the people groups he has placed you in.
- Think about how this message applies to the communities you are a part of .
- Think about how the people in this story acted as a community, and how God restored them as a group of people.



Revelation

Revelation is like a moment when our eyes are opened to something that we hadn't seen before.

Revelation is like an awakening with understanding.



Revelation

God revealed to Nehemiah the state of ruin Jerusalem was in through a visit from Nehemiah's brother. (Nehemiah 1:1-3)

God revealed his plan when the spirit of God "roused" the people to go up and rebuild the house of the Lord. (Ezra 1:5)



Revelation

- God revealed his plan when he moved leaders outside of the Jewish community to act.
- King Cyrus of Persia was moved by God to issue a decree releasing the Jews and for rebuilding the House of the Lord in Jerusalem.
- King Artaxerxes allowed Nehemiah to go to Jerusalem to rebuild the walls and provided him with royal documents that provided for safe travels and the procurement of resources. (A foreign government helped pay to rebuild the City of God.)

Representation & Relocation

- Someone from every family group showed up.
- They relocated and took responsibility for a section of the wall.
- God is calling his people to be responsible for one another, to show up, to cover their part of the work to be done.

It takes a team.

Rebuilding the wall wasn't about individual effort. But it does demonstrate the result of individuals coming together, leveraging their sweat and skills as a group to accomplish God's mission.

Rebuilding & Renovation

They weren't just rebuilding the wall, they were rebuilding their relationship with God as a community.

As believers in Jesus Christ, we are not just responsible for our own individual spiritual growth. We have a responsibility to invest in the spiritual growth of others.
