- 1. Forgiveness and reconciliation are two different concepts. Forgiveness must occur first, then reconciliation.
- Forgiveness Luke 11:4 And forgive us our sins, For we ourselves also forgive everyone who is indebted to us. ...
- Reconciliation Eph 2:13 "you who once were far off have been brought near... 15 For He himself is our peace, who made both groups into one, …"

2. Reconciliation, unlike forgiveness, requires *repentance* on the part of the offender(s).

Reconciliation.

- A. Takes two. V 2:15 (both groups); v 2:17
- *B. Requires repentance* of the offender. Luke 3:3, 8; Luke 17:3-4
- C. Attempt to reconcile is commanded by Jesus. Matt 5:23-24; Rom 12:18

3. Christ died on a cross to reconcile the world to himself. How can reconciliation with others not be the goal for Christ's followers?

- A. The sins of the whole world are forgiven through the cross. 1 John 2:2
- B. We receive forgiveness when we open the gift offered us by Jesus by faith. Eph 2:8

C. We are reconciled with God through our repentance. This restores us to God and makes us one with Christ. Acts 3:19, Acts 2:38; 1 John 2:4-5

Next steps.

- A. Use the "HELPS" tool and process an area of your heart where unforgiveness is tucked away. Listen to the series of sermons online again.
- B. Ask the Holy Spirit to identify those in your life you have forgiven but are not reconciled with. Pray about approaching them for reconciliation.
