Acts 14:1-3; 8-19 The Importance of Persistence in following the Will of God

Objectives of Series:

- That we embrace, welcome, the 3rd person of the Trinity, the HS; that our fears of the HS would be replaced by our friendship with the HS.
- 2. That we **become reliant** upon the power of the HS so that our verbal witness of Jesus might be filled with the HS.
- 3. That we *be re-invigorated* by the HS so that we might be useful for the purposes of the HS, whatever that might be.



1. What can we learn from Paul about the importance of surrendering our lives to the will of God instead of our own will?

Persistence: Continuing firmly or obstinately in a course of action despite difficulty or opposition:

 Someone who is persistent continues trying to do something, even though it is difficult or other people are against it.

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2. The same spiritual forces that hindered Paul's missionary work are at work today.

- Cyprus magician "son of the devil" hindering the proconsul from coming to faith.
- 2. "Poisoning the minds"
- 3. "Won the people over" of those seeking the true Savior. Antioch, Iconium, Lystra.

3. How do we understand the miracle in the text and the role of faith in a miracle? What about Paul's response to the acclaim of the people?

- 1. Purpose to bear witness to Jesus, 14:3
- The man had the faith to be healed. Cf Acts 3:6.
- Miracles are God's doing. Paul's response is a lesson to believers whose spiritual gifts are more public than others. "Glory" is God's alone.
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4. Paul and Barnabas were totally dependent upon the HS. Everything was spoken, took place, in the "language" of the listener.

- 1. First message addressed to adherents of another religion. (Greek mythology)
- 2. First open-air sermon (not in synagogue).
- 3. First specific, single, healing by Paul.
- 4. First message wo mention of Jesus.(??)
- 5. Only message that resulted in Paul being stoned. 2 Cor 11:25
