1. What "evidence" is there of the resurrection? Why are the details different in the gospel accounts?

- A. The basics of what happened. Luke 24:6-7
- 24:6 "Remember how he told you ... in Galilee..." Luke 9:22, Luke 9:44, Luke 24:46
- Luke 7:35- Jesus told them before it happened.

How Do You Explain...?

- A. Day of worship, from Saturday to Sunday. Luke 24:1, Acts 20:7
- B. Disciples from fearful to fearless. John 20:19; from isolated to active witnesses. Lk 24:2
- C. "Messiah" different meaning. Acts 1:6, Lk 24:19
- D. Christianity as a major world religion witness of 120 followers? Acts 1:15
- E. "Atonement" different meaning. Isaiah 53




2. The cross & resurrection, working together, are a "God-speak" that distinguishes Christianity from all other world religions. Together, they give me the fresh start that is only found in Jesus.

- A. In the cross Jesus takes my sin upon himself along with its consequence, death.
- B. In the Resurrection what was once dead, comes to life. Only God, the Creator of all things, can accomplish this. God speaks thru the resurrection declaring the work of the cross to truly be finished.







3. The Resurrection creates a "fork in the road" for believers. Will I be a follower of a "living Jesus" or a "dead Jesus"? A silent witness or a living witness?

- A. First witnesses to the resurrection:
 - Females (birth shepherds)
 - 24:9; 24:11 (silly women!)
- B. Resurrection offers believers an opportunity to be a part of something bigger than themselves. Jesus is alive is BIG!
