

The Divine Blueprint for Spiritual Growth (and Life) John 15:1 - 6



- A. True vine Only one among other false vines. Jn. 15:1
- B. His promise is real life. John 1:4, Isaiah 55:1-2




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Rev 22:17 "And let the one who is thirsty come; let the one who wishes take the water of life without cost."



- 2. John 15 is a "Divine Blueprint" for the importance of bearing fruit for each of us, individually, and for all of us, together.
- A. The "vine" Jesus. J 15:1, 5;
- B. The "branches" believers. J 15:2, 5
- C. The "vinedresser" (gardener). God (HS) J 15:1
- D. Believers "abide" in Christ. Intentionally "connected" w Christ. Branches must be connected to the source of life to become givers of life to others. We "bear fruit" bc we abide.

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- 3. As we abide in Christ, we bear fruit for Christ wherever we are or go.
 - A. Abide Intentional, seeking, presence with Jesus and his word. John 8:31-32
 - Transforms my belief system as I personalize the Word of God to my life circumstances
 - My life is modeled after Jesus. 1 John 2:4-6
 - B. Bear fruit in the same way that Jesus did. 2 Cor 2:14-16

- "Abiding in Christ" is the means whereby the divine purposes of Christ are achieved. Apart from abiding, we can do nothing of spiritual value.
- A. 15:2, the **vinedresser's** goal: that every branch bear fruit.
- B. 15:4, the **means** of achieving the goal: abiding in Christ.
- C. 15:5, a **promise** with a **condition** if we abide, fruit will be born.
- D. 15:5, We **can do nothing** of spiritual value apart from **abiding** in Christ.

 How does the HS "prune" our lives spiritually? What does the absence of "fruit" in a believer's life reveal to that believer?

A. John 15:2, John 15:6

 Pruning is a "good" thing. Being thrown away as a branch does not mean I lose my salvation. Rather, Christ's purposes are "in neutral" in my life.
