A. Man is at *work* - just looking for \$\$. • **Distracted** by his "normal" - Temple gate. **B. Oblivious** to what the HS is going to do. • V4. Looked at him intently • V4. "Look at us! • V4. He looked, expecting some money. C. What if there is something the Holy Spirit wants to do in your life?

The man was a *living example* of someone beaten up by *life* who now was "*alive*"!

 Peter's words to the gathered crowd who knew the lame beggar; and had yelled "crucify him" to Pilate:

• Acts 3:15 You killed the *author of life*, but God raised him from the dead. And we are witnesses of this fact! (NLT) "*Author of life*" has meaning relevant to our finding life.

- A. "Author."
 - Latin word "auctor" creator, originator.
 - One who shares original content, has person knowledge on a subject.
 - Ownership of idea.
 - Objective to share his or her truth.
- B. Taught with *real authority*. Matt 7:28-29

2. The *author of life* is the only one who can give us real life!

A. Human life in the here and now.
Google vs Jesus? John 10:9-10, 6:63
B. Spiritual life.
Second birth. John 3:6-7, 3-5
C. We can only receive what he gives.
Acts 2:38

3. What word from the Lord would you ask the Holy Spirit to speak over you, today; over another?

 Acts 3:6 But Peter said, "I don't have any silver or gold for you. But I'll give you what I have. In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, get up and walk!" (NLT)
