A. Paul: For I feel a divine jealousy for you, since I betrothed you to one husband, to present you as a pure virgin to Christ. (2 Cor. 11:2 ESV)

B. Paul: Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church ..., ²⁶ that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her ... so that he might present the church to himself..., (Eph. 5:25-27 ESV)
