Naomi Blames God

 "Don't call me Naomi (pleasant). Call me Mara (bitter) for the Almighty has made me very bitter. I went away full, but the LORD has brought me back empty. Why do you call me Naomi, since the LORD has opposed me, and the Almighty has afflicted me?" Naomi's trauma has impacted her personal identity.

- Does your past define who you are as a person today?
- This moment in time is not the end of Naomi's story and you are not at the end of your story either.

- 1. She heard a rumor about God. She had heard in Moab that the Lod has paid attention to his people's need...
- 2. Ruth clings to Naomi.
 - 1. Don't plead with me to abandon you or return and not follow you. For wherever you go, I will go, and wherever you live, I will live; your people will be my people, and your God will be my God. Where you die, I will die, and there I will be buried. May the LORD punish me, and do so severely, if anything but death separates you and me.

Despite her own personal pain, Ruth demonstrates a tenacious, insistent, sticky, not easily torn asunder kind of love.

Before Naomi's Darkness

- Naomi must have been the best mother-inlaw.
- Both Ruth and Orpah wanted to go with her to Bethlehem.
- Although Naomi lost much, God's faithful love was personified in Ruth's relentless devotion to Naomi.

Naomi's Influence

Naomi's influence was a blessing to Ruth.
 Naomi's influence was the train track that
 God used to bring Ruth into the family of
 God, into a committed marriage, into
 motherhood, and the mother in the line
 from which the King of Israel and Jesus the
 Messiah would be born.

Naomi's Influence – Your Influence

- Do you think Naomi had any idea that she had influence?
- Do you realize that you have influence that God wants to use to shape those around you?
- Naomi had a generational impact. Moms, you too have influence and impact on future generations. What do you want that impact to look like?

- Even in Naomi's darkness, she still has the presence of mind to see a future for Ruth.
- Through the kindness of Boaz, Naomi allows her heart to hope for a future.

Grief's Partner

Spoiler Alert: The end to this story has been known for thousands of years.

 Boaz took Ruth and she became his wife. He slept with her, and the LORD granted conception to her, and she gave birth to a son. The women said to Naomi, "Blessed be the LORD, who has not left you without a family redeemer today. May his name become well known in Israel. He will renew your life and sustain you in your old age. Indeed, your daughter-in-law, who loves you and is better to you than seven sons, has given birth to him." Naomi took the child, placed him on her lap and became a mother to him. The neighbor women said, "A son has been born to Naomi," and they named him Obed, He was the father of Jesse, the father of David.
